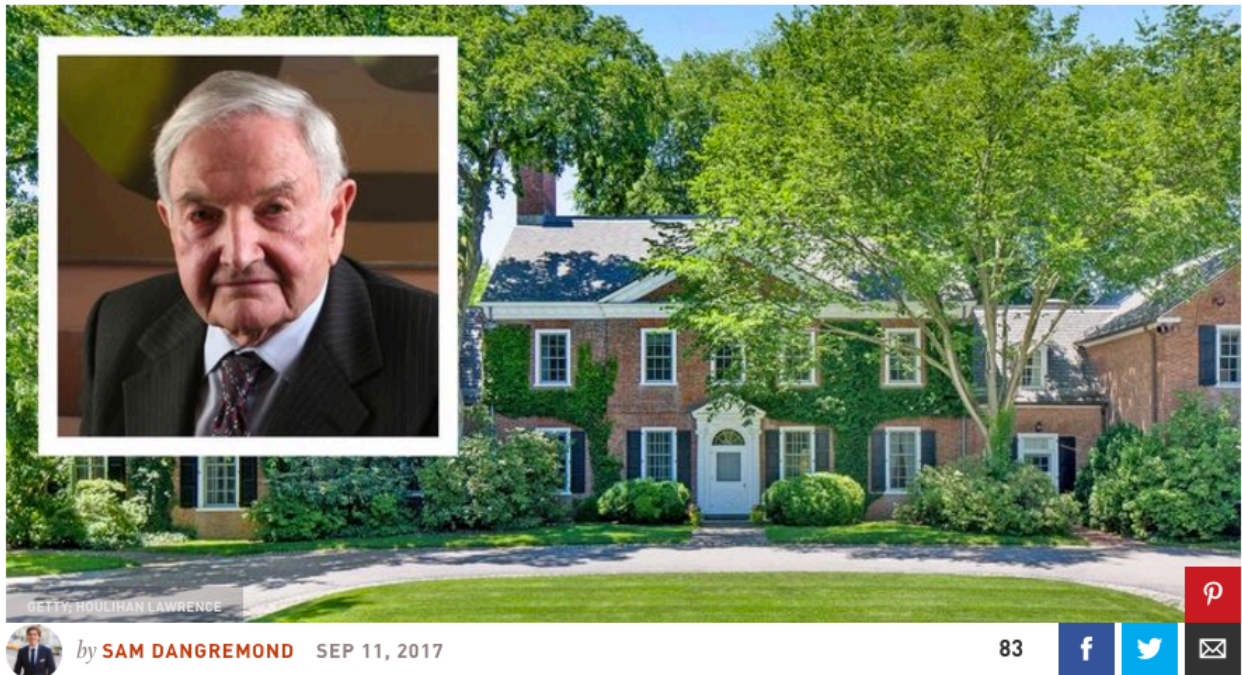

See Inside David Rockefeller's Stately Westchester Country House

Known as Hudson Pines, the 75-acre estate is on the market for \$22 million.



After philanthropist David Rockefeller [died this past March](#), his estate put his [New York City townhouse](#) and [house on Mount Desert Island in Maine](#) on the market. Now his country house outside Manhattan is also for sale—with an [asking price of \\$22 million](#). Scroll down for a look inside.

The house is set on 75 acres in Pocantico Hills in Westchester County.

It was designed in 1938 by noted architect Mott B. Schmidt, who's also responsible for the home that is now **Donald Trump's Bedminster Golf Club**.

The main residence includes 11 bedrooms and 12 full bathrooms with 11,000 square feet of living space.



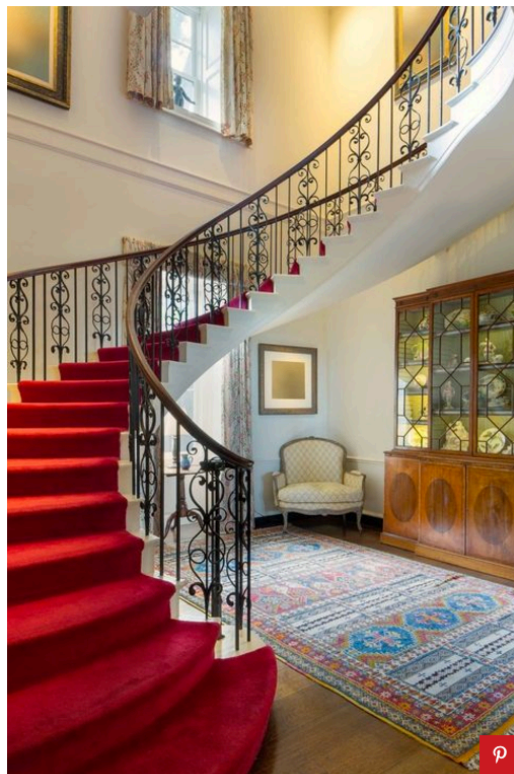
HOULIHAN LAWRENCE

It's about a mile from Kykuit, John D. Rockefeller's property that's now open to the public.

The front hall features a floating staircase.

There's also an elevator that provides access to the second floor.

The living room has views of a sweeping lawn outside along with the Hudson River.
