

## See Inside David Rockefeller's Stately Westchester Country House

Known as Hudson Pines, the 75-acre estate is on the market for \$22 million.



After philanthropist David Rockefeller <u>died this past March</u>, his estate put his <u>New York</u> <u>City townhouse</u> and <u>house on Mount Desert Island in Maine</u> on the market. Now his country house outside Manhattan is also for sale—with an <u>asking price of \$22 million</u>. Scroll down for a look inside.



## The house is set on 75 acres in Pocantico Hills in Westchester County.

It was designed in 1938 by noted architect Mott B. Schmidt, who's also responsible for the home that is now Donald Trump's Bedminster Golf Club.

The main residence includes 11 bedrooms and 12 full bathrooms with 11,000 square feet of living space.

It's about a mile from Kykuit, John D. Rockefeller's property that's now open to the public.

There's also an elevator that provides access to the second floor.

The living room has views of a sweeping lawn outside along with the Hudson River.



The dining room also overlooks the surrounding countryside.



The library has a carved fireplace and a separate office with its fireplace and full bathroom.



The master wing includes a private balcony and dual dressing room with fitted closets.



The gardens evoke those of England's famous Capability Brown.



The grounds also include a heated pool, helipad, playhouse, carriage house, three-bedroom gatehouse, three greenhouses, and a six-stall barn.
